


- Over 8,000 full and part-time students enrolled

- First community college in New Jersey to establish a selective **Honors College**

 - New 45,000 square-foot Workforce Training Center will prepare students for careers in automotive technology and advanced manufacturing, allied health, cosmetology and environmental control technology.
