The cumulative amount of money that Raritan Valley Community College received in HEERF funding for students was \$10,707,313.00. \$10,707,310.00, were distributed to students as emergency grants to offset the ravages of COVID-related impacts. Students were issued checks along with an explanation of their grant to their home address as well as college email. Unfortunately, 15 students did not cash their checks. All but \$3.00 was expended and then a \$13,950.00 adjustment was made due uncashed checks.

Each semester, RVCC's Finance Department would reconcile the amounts of checks distributed with the amounts of checks that were cashed. When it was uncovered that a student check was not cashed, the Finance Department and the Office of Student Affairs would make numerous attempts to notify the student of their unclaimed emergency grant. For the most part, this worked and students either cashed the original check, or in some cases, the Finance Office cancelled the original check and sent out a new check.

For the 15 students with uncashed checks, RVCC has been unable to contact them and after trying to reach them for over six-months, decided to cancel the outstanding checks and send the money back to the US Department of Education. RVCC will continue to follow reconciliation procedures to ensure the continued integrity of the grant funding process.

RVCC's students benefited greatly from the HEERF funding and many were able to stay enrolled at college during the COVID years.
