PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Introduction

The Art Institute of Philadelphia ("AiPH") and Raritan Valley Community College ("RVCC") agree to follow and adhere to the following provisions:

The parties will maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter this agreement as equal partners. The parties agree to implement the appropriate curriculum in mutually agreed designated programs for the purpose of assuring students technical competencies that will enhance their skill levels, their employability, and their career options.

Further, program curricula approved under this Agreement shall be developed according to the process prescribed, in Article IV. Program curricula covered under this Agreement are regularly reviewed and updated according to the method stipulated in Article IV. In addition, a course-articulation matrix and forms used in the process indicating RVCC courses for which AiPH credit may be awarded are included as appendices to this Agreement.

*All students participating in this program articulation agreement, must meet all admission requirements of AiPH.

Article I

Articulated Programs

This Agreement establishes articulation for the Bachelor of Science degree programs offered by AiPH with Associate degree programs offered by RVCC. This Agreement also sets forth criteria by which AiPH credit will be awarded to RVCC students for coursework completed at RVCC.

Students who have documented their intention to pursue a specific articulated program curriculum and who have successfully completed the secondary articulated program curriculum required for articulated program designation may be awarded AiPH credit for courses specified in appended Course-to-Course Articulation Matrices.

Following are rules governing award of AiPH credit and the criteria that must be met in order for RVCC students to be awarded quarter hour credit by AiPH.

- A. Students seeking AiPH credit via enrollment in courses included in RVCC curriculum must be identified by RVCC as articulated students through a declaration of intent (signed *Student* Intent form).
- B. AiPH credit earned by students enrolled in RVCC will partially fulfill the requirements for award of a bachelor of science degree in an approved articulated program.

- C. The student must complete all graduation requirements from RVCC and must meet all of the program admissions requirements of AiPH.
- D. Students must earn **at least a grade of C** in coursework completed while at RVCC to be awarded AiPH credits for the course and enter the AiPH program <u>without</u> remediation in the courses for which the student receives AiPH credit.
- E. Credit for articulated course(s) will be posted with a "TR" designation to the student's AiPH record upon enrollment at AiPH.
- F. Award of articulated course credit through programs covered by this agreement with AiPH will be considered on an individual case basis if more than one (1) year has elapsed since the student seeking the credit has completed the post-secondary course credit(s).
- G. Program(s) and/or course(s) may be added to this Articulation Agreement as agreed upon by the parties.
- H. This agreement will be in effect until either party makes substantive curriculum changes to the agreed upon articulated courses. When substantive curriculum changes occur, it will be the responsibility of the institution initiating the change to notify the other participating institution.

Article II

Financial Responsibilities

No financial obligation is incurred by either party for the award of AiPH credit through this Program Articulation Agreement. Upon application for admission to AiPH, the student will be required to pay all normal fees.

Article III

Development of Additional Programs

Participating programs of AiPH will continue to communicate and cooperate in the development of additional articulated programs. Such programs will be appended to this document upon recommendation from the Evaluation Committee, established by Article IV and approved by the school Executive Committee.

Article IV

Establishment of Evaluation Committee

The parties will establish and maintain an Evaluation Committee for the following purposes with regard to this articulation agreement:

- a.) To agree upon appropriate leveling curricula that result in accelerated student learning to be implemented at the post-secondary level
- b.) To advise students with regard to exceptional situations.

Each party will designate a contact person to conduct business and receive communications from the other party under this agreement. All additional agreements and evaluation pertaining to this Program Articulation Agreement will be consistent with local policies and procedures that govern the state Consortiums and with program requirements established by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and program requirements established by the appropriate accrediting agency.

Article V

Conditions For Termination

Either party may withdraw from this agreement by giving thirty days' notice in writing to the designated contact person for the other party.

Institutional withdrawal will not affect the award of AiPH credit to RVCC students who have met the criteria for credit award established herein, while this agreement is in effect.
