## Proposed Guidelines for Articulation Agreements Between Benedict College and Raritan Valley Community College

The purpose of this document is to establish guidelines for the development of articulation agreements between Benedict College and Raritan Valley Community College. These guidelines and subsequent program-specific articulation agreements are intended to facilitate transfer of students from Raritan Valley Community College into baccalaureate programs at Benedict College. By closely examining and improving the transfer function, Benedict College and Raritan Valley Community College hope to increase and encourage access to baccalaureate education for two-year college transfer students, including minorities and other under-represented populations.

## Guidelines

The following guidelines shall govern the development of articulation agreements between Benedict College and Raritan Valley Community College. A maximum of 60 semester hours may be transferred to Benedict College to meet the first two years of credit requirements of the baccalaureate degree.

- 1. Raritan Valley Community College shall examine the associate in arts and associate in science degrees to insure that the majority of credits in these degrees can be recognized as meeting the general education requirements for the baccalaureate degree.
- 2. Because graduates in technical and paraprofessional associate degree programs are transferring to baccalaureate programs in increasing numbers, and because many of these associate degrees require preparation which would qualify students to pursue a baccalaureate degree, special efforts shall be made to develop articulation agreements for majors in career fields in which both Benedict College and Raritan Valley Community College offer degree programs, for example, business, criminal justice, social/human services, etc.
- 3. The chief academic officers and their designated faculty will develop and approve detailed course-by-course articulation guides for each articulated major and shall insure that all appropriate faculty and counselors have such information and comply with such agreements when advising students.
- 4. Minimum grade of "C" (2.0) in a course is necessary for transfer credit to be awarded for that course.
- 5. Although a course may be transferable into a baccalaureate program at Benedict College, it may not be applied to a specific major in all instances. In such cases, credit will be transferred as elective credit.
- 6. Benedict College and Raritan Valley Community College will notify the other of changes in the curriculum. Although course numbers may change, each party will accept

originally agreed upon comparable courses until such time as this agreement is modified. Additionally, this agreement will be reviewed every two-years, but will remain in effect until modified by either party.

This agreement is effective until such time that either party officially terminates the agreement in writing. The termination shall be effective six (6) months after receipt of written notification.
