



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

The purpose of this **Articulation Agreement** between Raritan Valley Community College ("Partner") and Trident University International ("TUI") is to memorialize the commitment of the Partner and TUI to providing greater educational opportunities and services for students transferring between institutions. This agreement confirms the intention of the parties to creating a seamless transfer embracing the principle that transfer students should not be required to repeat competencies already achieved. In consideration of the foregoing and mutual promises hereinafter set forth the parties agree as follows:

Based on an evaluation of the rigor and content of the degree requirements at the Partner institution and the general education requirements at Trident University International along with the Bachelor degree program requirements, students and alumni transferring from the Partner institution, having completed an Associate in Science or Associate of Arts degree, will be granted the course equivalencies in all Bachelor's degree programs at Trident University International. Partner graduates with Associates degrees will transfer a minimum of 60 semester credits to Trident.

Curriculum maps are available for each transferrable program and are attached hereto and incorporated by reference in Appendix A.

1. TUI also agrees to:

- 1.1 Provide its student centric, quality, fully online, regionally accredited (WASC), degree programs to Partner students, alumni and employees.
- 1.2 Allow Partner students, alumni and employees to participate in workshops, webinars and other events established and conducted during the term of this articulation agreement by TUI for the Partner.
- 1.3 Send tuition statements to, and directly bill the student for all tuition costs and other fees, unless otherwise requested by Partner. It shall be the student's responsibility to pay all incurred amounts.
- 1.4 Provide Partner recruiting benefits through our Career Advising and Development Center.
- 1.5 Offer the following benefits to Partner students, alumni and employees who are officially admitted to and attend TUI programs, provided that the student identifies Partner as his or her school on the TUI Application for Admission.



- A waiver of any application fees
- No cost access to the TUI cyber library, including textbook library
- A current tuition savings of:
 - Bachelors: **20%** discount off the prevailing tuition rate applicable to that student's chosen program.
 - Masters: **26%** discount off the prevailing tuition rate applicable to that student's chosen program.
 - Doctoral: **11%** discount off the prevailing tuition rate applicable to that student's chosen program.
- *Tuition savings commence the first session after the effective date of this agreement.*
- *No tuition credit, repayment, or refund shall be made for or to any Partner student relating to classes enrolled in or attended prior to the first session post-effective date.*
- *Partner students are not entitled to any other tuition reductions and are subject to all TUI policies and requirements applicable to other students.*

While tuition is always subject to change, under current pricing, the percentage and actual savings are presented in the following table:

2. Partner also agrees to:

- 2.1 Assist TUI in organizing onsite information events and tables, booths, webinars, co-branded Community College intranet partner page links, material distribution and/or access to communicate the benefits of this articulation agreement through the promotion of TUI programs.



2.2 The Partner will grant TUI access to the Partner's students, alumni and employees a minimum of four (4) times annually through mutually agreeable events, agreement to which will not unreasonably be withheld.

2.3 The Partner will post relevant information relating to this agreement on their website(s).

2.4 The Partner agrees to inform its students and recent alumni of the terms and opportunities of this agreement.

3. General Terms and Conditions:

3.1 It is mutually agreed that this agreement may be modified only in writing and by mutual consent of the parties at any time, until its expiration.

3.2 The parties acknowledge that from time to time either party may disclose to the other confidential and/or proprietary and non-public information, which under the circumstances such party should reasonably know to be confidential or proprietary. Each party agrees that it shall not use or disclose any confidential or proprietary information belonging to the other party and shall take reasonable security precautions, at least as great as the precautions it takes to protect its own confidential and proprietary information or its own information of like character and importance, but in no event less than reasonable care, to protect the confidential and proprietary information. The confidentiality obligations set forth herein shall continue for one (1) year after termination of this Agreement.

3.3 The term of this agreement is two (2) years from the Effective Date and will automatically renew for one (1) additional year unless either party submits written notice of non-renewal at least ninety (90) days before the expiration of the current term of this agreement. Each party agrees to notify the other if material changes are made to any program/course offering that can affect this articulation. Any such changes will necessitate an addendum that will be attached to this articulation agreement.

3.4 Renewal of the agreement following the one year renewal will be subject to a new agreement.

3.5 It is agreed that in the event of termination of this agreement, all Partner active students will continue to benefit from the specified reduced tuition until their graduation/program completion. Any unauthorized or unapproved break in enrollment (absence from the next available session) will subject students to the full tuition rate in place at the time of return from the unauthorized or unapproved breaks in enrollment.



- 3.6 Regardless of the manner in which the courses are provided, the courses, software and course materials are provided in their "as is" condition without warranty of any kind. TUI makes no warranties, express, or implied, including the implied warranties of merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose and non-infringement with respect to the courses, software and related materials and does not represent or guarantee that Partner's personnel will achieve any particular course grade or level of academic level achievement.
- 3.7 Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to make either party an agent, employee, partner or joint venture of the other party. Neither party shall have any authority to bind, commit, or otherwise obligate the other party in any manner whatsoever.
- 3.8 Any course, workshop or webinar materials furnished by TUI and any information relating thereto contain valuable and confidential information which is proprietary to TUI and which constitutes trade secrets and copyrighted material of TUI. All right, title, and interest in and to the materials shall remain vested in TUI. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to convey any ownership rights in the materials to Partner.
- 3.9 Each party agrees and represents that all information each party provides the other for the purpose of this Agreement will be accurate, complete and current. By signing this Agreement, each party warrants that it: (1) is authorized to enter this Agreement, (2) this Agreement is legal and binding according to its terms; (3) will not engage in any act or omission that infringes or violates any laws or regulations or the rights of any person, a third party or entity, or that gives rise to any claim of unfair competition, discrimination, or promotes obscenity, violence, hate speech, or allows the distribution of deleterious programs; (4) will fully indemnify the other party (including officers, directors, members, owners, and employees and agents) as to and to the extent a third party claim, if true, would constitute a breach of this Agreement.
- 3.10 This Agreement constitutes the sole and exclusive statement of the terms and conditions of the Agreement to provide education services and supersedes any prior discussions, writings, and negotiations with respect thereto. This Agreement shall not be amended unless in writing executed by both parties.
- 3.11 TUI hereby grants Partner a (i) limited and non-exclusive, revocable royalty-free license to use TUI's names, logos, service marks or trademarks ("University Marks"), and (ii) a license to use TUI's name as a reference in Partner's marketing and other promotional materials, in each case solely for purposes of performing Partner's obligations and exercising Partner's rights under this Agreement. Partner may not use any University Mark(s) or otherwise reference TUI in any marketing, promotional, public relations announcements or other materials, including on websites owned or operated by Partner, until such uses and materials in whatever form will have been previously submitted to






and approved in writing by TUI. The licenses granted by TUI to Partner in this Section will terminate upon the termination of this Agreement. Except for what is set forth in this Section, no rights or licenses with respect to any intellectual property are granted under this Agreement.

- 3.12 Partner hereby grants TUI a (i) limited and non-exclusive, revocable royalty-free license to use Partner's names, logos, service marks or trademarks ("Partner Marks"), and (ii) a license to use Partner's name as a reference in TUI's marketing and other promotional materials, in each case solely for purposes of performing TUI's obligations and exercising TUI's rights under this Agreement. TUI may use any Partner Mark(s) or otherwise reference Partner in any marketing, promotional, public relations announcements or other materials, including on websites owned or operated by TUI, consistent with the example provided in Appendix B. The licenses granted by Partner to TUI in this Section will terminate upon the termination of this Agreement. Except for what is set forth in this Section, no rights or licenses with respect to any intellectual property are granted under this Agreement.

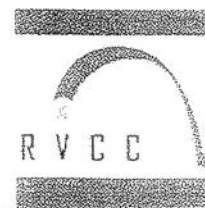
