1. This document confirms the transfer/progression opportunities available to students at Raritan Community College who wish to continue or complete their studies at the University of Greenwich.
2. All applications will be considered on individual merit and the University of Greenwich retains the right to reject applications it considers unsuitable. Acceptance onto University of Greenwich programmes shall remain at the absolute discretion of the University of Greenwich and shall be subject to applicants meeting all conditions of any offers that are made.
3. The University of Greenwich and Raritan Community College are responsible for reviewing the Transfer/Progression Agreement on an annual basis to ensure that the mapping exercise remains accurate and to monitor any changes in curriculum. The reviews may take place in person or may be undertaken via an exchange of email correspondence but in any case a written record shall acknowledge that an annual review has taken place and that the Agreement and the mapping exercise remains satisfactory for both Institutions.
4. The University of Greenwich and Raritan Community College hereby confirm that they have undertaken a mapping exercise of courses and programmes to determine which classes have learning outcomes which are deemed the same as, or equivalent to, classes at the University of Greenwich. Confirmation of this mapping exercise and course equivalencies are as below.
