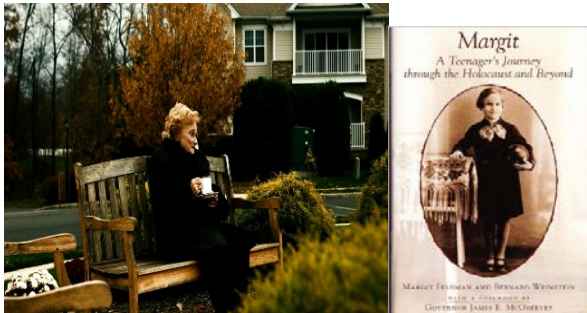
**Jacqueline Murekatete, Child Survivor of  
The Rwandan Genocide**

Born in Rwanda, Jacqueline Murekatete was nine years old when she lost her parents, all six siblings, and all of her extended family in the 1994 genocide against the Tutsi in Rwanda. Jacqueline is an internationally recognized genocide survivor and human rights activist. She is the founder of Genocide Survivors Foundation (GSF) as vehicle to continue her genocide prevention efforts and raise support for fellow genocide survivors. Jacqueline has a B.A. in Politics from New York University and a J.D from Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law.
