II. Catalog Description

Prerequisite: Audition/approval is required for RVCC Chorale I only. Each consecutive course becomes the prerequisite for the next level.

This large ensemble course provides opportunity for the study and performance of choral literature in a wide variety of styles. Weekly rehearsals and one or more public performances are required. For the music major, RVCC Chorale I, II, III and IV should be taken in sequence, and different repertory will be featured each semester. Students will improve their ensemble skills and their music reading ability. Other students (not music majors) may take Chorale on a credit or non-credit basis. Other interested community participants are welcome to join the RVCC Chorale on a non-credit, feepaying basis through the Division of Corporate and Continuing Education.

III. Statement of Course Need:

A. The course is a standard offering of community college, four-year college and university music curricula, often open to student and community participants. Specifically, all collegiate music programs require their majors to participate in large ensembles, such as choirs, bands, and orchestras, during each semester of their enrollment.

The RVCC Chorale plays an important role in the cultural life of the multi-county area. The Chorale provides a musically intimate and exciting experience and fellowship for singers of many ages and backgrounds.

B. Course transferability: Based on evaluations at the njtransfer.org website, the RVCC Chorale courses will transfer to most colleges and universities (including Rutgers University, William Paterson University, Kean University, Rowan University and The College of New Jersey) as the equivalent ensemble performance requirement in Associate or Bachelor music programs.

V. Outline of Course Content:

- A. Courses will consist of college-level repertory from choral literature selected by the Director.
- B. Repertory will vary each semester.
- C. Participants rehearse together weekly and will perform a public concert at the end of the semester.
- D. Other public performances may be given at on-campus or at off-campus venues.

VI. General Education and Course Learning Outcomes

The student will:

1. Demonstrate musical, ensemble and vocal skills and exemplify aesthetic, creative and cultural awareness through the study and performance of the art and techniques of choral literature and of choral singing. (GE- NJ 6, *)

B. Course Learning Outcomes

The student will be able to:

- 1. Apply ensemble skills as choral singers.
- 2. Employ musical and technical (vocal) skills as ensemble musicians and as performers.
- 3. Demonstrate an understanding of a variety of musical styles.
- 4. Rehearse and present public performances of choral music, both a cappella (unaccompanied) and accompanied by piano or instruments.

C. Assessment Instruments:

- 1. Public performances as examinations
- 2. Weekly rehearsal participation, including attendance, effort and attitude

VII. Grade Determinants

The grade determinants will include the demonstration of progress as a vocalist and ensemble musician, as well as attendance at all rehearsals and scheduled performances.

Formats, modes and methods that may be used for teaching and learning:

- A. Full ensemble rehearsals and performances
- B. Sectional rehearsals and/or smaller ensemble combinations
- C. Guest conductors or vocal coaches
- D. Student collaboration

VIII. Texts and Materials

Appropriate repertory for the RVCC Chorale will be selected each semester by the Director. Music will be supplied by the Department from its music library, borrowed from similar organizations or colleges, purchased or rented.

- A. Rehearsal studio with piano and appointments.
